4 Views on Humanness

- 1) Humans as Machines Views persons based upon their productivity.
- "They are of value as long as they are useful" Erickson, 156
- "Augustine said, we should *love* people and *use* things, not vice versa. Those who use people and love things are doing something profoundly immoral because they are not recognizing the inherent worth and dignity of other persons, who are not mere things to be used." William Lane Craig

2) Humans as Animals

- Humans are merely "higher animals"
- Apply the findings of animal experiments to humans (humans have no soul/spirit).
- Positive reinforcement
- Negative reinforcement
- No "sanctity" of human life


Argument: There's plenty of humans already!
We should be concerned about
"diversification of species," not "speciesism"
in favor of **only** humans!

3) Humans as "Pawns of the Universe"

- We are the pawns of Fate/Luck/Blind Chance/world politics
- Conspiracy theories
- "All those who hold that humans are basically pawns at the mercy of the universe are gripped by a similar sense of helplessness and resignation." Erickson, 157.
- *Punishment of Sisyphus

2) Western philosophy: History & the future is doomed - Pessimism





4) Humans as creatures of God in the image of God

- Not through random processes but through a conscious act of God's will.
- b. Thus, there is a *point and purpose* of human existence.
- c. The *point and purpose* is found in the intention of the Creator.
- "To love God and enjoy Him forever."
- "Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man." Ecclesiastes 12:13

4) Humans as creatures of God in the image of God

- d. God is eternal who created humans with an eternal future.
- *Finite beginning, eternal future.
